The basis of the Plan is that those Governments which are able to do so should institute fellowships to be held by men and women from other Commonwealth countries at universities and other institutions of higher learning in the awarding country. At present nearly twenty countries of the Commonwealth award fellowships under the Plan while nominations are received from all the Commonwealth countries. The Annual Reports provide summary reports from the countries on the working of the Plan and useful statistical analyses.
