Description

- Questionnaires about educational, social, cultural and economic backgrounds as well as details of part-time commitments have been sent to about 400 primary school teachers, representative of public-maintained and privately-owned schools of the various educational agencies in the Lagos area. About 250 teachers have, so far, returned their questionnaires.

A selected number of these teachers have been visited, as they performed their part-time duties, with a view to ascertaining the degrees of their involvement. This is now being followed by informal visits while these teachers are at work in their schools in order to assess the extent to which their part-time commitments affect their efficiency as classroom teachers. Devices for carrying out the assessment include:

- i) informal observation of the teacher at classroom teaching, bearing in mind all the essentials of good teaching;
- ii) examining pupils' class written work as well as results of internal and external examinations;
- iii) studying the involvement of the teacher in relevant extra-curricular activities of the school; and
- iv) a possible use of older and mature
 pupils' assessments of the performances
 of their teachers.
